School Board News

School board launches superintendent recruitment process

Pembina Hills Public Schools has strong and committed staff who work hard every day to provide high quality education to students within our geographic area and across the province. Our division is more complex than most, with 3,900 students in community schools, 7,800 students with Vista Virtual School and another 44,000 students who count on the Alberta Distance Learning Centre. The board is committed to ensuring that everyone in the division has the support and leadership they need. Therefore, the board intends to have a superintendent in place this August before the start of the new school year. The school board has hired Alberta School Boards Association consultant Jim Gibbons to assist in the recruitment and hiring of a Superintendent of Schools. The current five-year contract for the position of superintendent expires July 31, 2017 and the board has decided not to renew it.

Supporting leaders and building capacity

In order to ensure that our schools have strong leadership through their principal and associate principal the board has approved a minimum amount of administration time that must be budgeted for at each school. Our principals are the leaders in their buildings, and will have increased expectations this coming school year in leading the professional development of staff. In order to enable strong leadership at the school level we have to ensure that principals are provided with the time to lead.

Provincial budget

The budget had a neutral effect on Pembina Hills – changes were the result of our decline in enrolment resulting in a loss of funding. PHPS numbers are declining in the higher grade levels, but seem to be increasing in lower elementary which is a positive sign for the future!



Roots of Empathy

Our grade ½ class has been participating in the Roots of Empathy program this year and have had the opportunity to watch our baby “Greyson” grow through-out the year. Roots of Empathy is a program that teaches children about feelings, their own feelings, and the feelings of others (empathy). Once every three weeks a baby and her/her parent(s) visit the classroom. A trained ROE instructor gathers the children in the classroom around a green blanket and together they watch the baby grow. Children learn to respect and care for one another with the lessons through their Roots of Empathy baby.

If you are going to be a parent of an infant who will be 2-4 months at the start of the 2017-2018 (September to Mid-November) and would like your baby to be our “tiny teacher”, we would love to hear from you. It is a voluntary commitment that lasts though out the school year, 9 visits into the classroom, 30- 45 minutes each, every three weeks.

Student Legal Documentation:

Each year, School Finance implements internal controls to ensure that resources allocated by Alberta Education are allocated according to the funding conditions set out in the Funding Manual for School Authorities 2012/2013. The funded enrolment verification process is one of these controls.

To claim a student as eligible for funding, that student must meet the funding conditions set out in the Glossary under Funded Student.

To substantiate the funding claims for the students, School Jurisdictions are required to submit documentation to support age and citizenship, and residency.

Fort Assiniboine School is reviewing all our student files to ensure compliance with Alberta Education requirements, in the event they select for review your child registration file we have to be certain that the following document is in place

*** Birth Certificate or other documentation to support age and citizenship**

Examples of acceptable documentation to support age and citizenship are: Birth Certificate (Canadian), Passport (Canadian), Immigration Papers (including Refugee), Treaty Card (Number), Permanent Resident Card, Adoption Papers, Temporary Resident Papers, Legal Guardianship (Court Order), Parent's Work or Study Permit, Parent's Citizenship

To assist us in supporting our claim for funding for your child's education we need you to provide a copy of the requested documentation to the school.

Dear Parents and Guardians,

I am pleased to share with you some information about Bill 1: An Act to Reduce School Fees, which our government recently introduced in the legislature. By introducing this legislation, our government is working to make life better and more affordable for Alberta families.

If Bill 1 is passed, these fee reductions will come into effect this fall and no Alberta family will be required to pay for instructional supplies or materials, or for certain types of student transportation, as outlined below. These two school fees represent approximately 25 per cent of the fees collected each year by school boards, and reducing them would lead to Alberta families saving more than \$50 million annually.

Instructional supplies or materials include fees for textbooks, workbooks, printing and paper costs incurred by their public schools. It also includes any common fees that are charged to an entire student body, or grade cohort. These fees can be referred to as—among other titles—instructional fees, instructional materials or basic fees. To date, school fees have varied significantly from school to school, so your savings will depend on the type and amount of fees currently charged by your child's school.

Bill 1, if passed, will also remove bus fees for eligible students traveling to their designated school. That means that if your child attends his or her designated school and that school is more than 2.4 kilometres away from your home, you will not be charged transportation fees. In some circumstances—for example, if parents choose to enrol their child in a school other than their designated school—fees may still be incurred.

Our government understands that times are tough for Alberta families and is working to make education more affordable. We believe that all students deserve access to a quality education in an Alberta school, and we are committed to reducing financial barriers such as school fees.

Dear parents and guardians,

RE: Proposed changes to school fees

Earlier this spring, we posted a story on our division website entitled, "How will the govt. proposal to reduce school fees affect parents?". The story was in response to the Government of Alberta announcing the introduction of Bill 1 to reduce school fees. Attached is a copy of Education Minister David Eggen's letter to parents and guardians regarding Bill 1.

The Bill passed third reading on April 19, eliminating the following fees:

Busing fees for students who attend their designated school and who live more than 2.4 kilometres from the school. We do not charge busing fees to these students, so this will not impact families in our school division.

School fees for basic educational services and supplies. This includes things like textbooks, workbooks, printing, software licenses, agendas and paper costs. Currently we charge these school fees to PHPS students: Kindergarten - \$60; Grades 1 to 6 - \$70; Grades 7 to 12 - \$110 to \$140 (varies by school); Family rate - \$300. This fall we will no longer be charging these fees.

We are pleased that the province recognizes the costs associated with these items and will be providing us with a grant to cover the costs.

Please note that we will continue to charge fees for in-town busing and for students who ride the bus to a school other than their designated school.

Also, schools will continue to charge fees for enhanced educational services and non-curricular activities. This includes things like field trips, resale supplies, milk programs, hot lunch programs, sports teams, clubs, etc. For more information on these types of fees, contact your child's school.

We look forward to working with you to provide an excellent education for your children, and are pleased to see the government strive to reduce costs for families.
