What is Orange T-shirt Day?

Every Child Matters

Orange Shirt Day is a legacy of the St. Joseph Mission (SJM) Residential School (1891-1981) Commemoration Project and Reunion events that took place in Williams Lake, BC, Canada, in May 2013. This project was the vision of Esketemc (Alkali Lake) Chief Fred Robbins, who is a former student himself.

The events were designed to commemorate the residential school experience, to witness and honour the healing journey of the survivors and their families, and to commit to the ongoing process of reconciliation. Chief Justice Murray Sinclair challenged all of the participants to keep the reconciliation process alive, and as a result of the realization that every former student had similar stories.

Orange Shirt Day is a legacy of this project. Former student Phyllis (Jack) Webstad told her story of her first day at residential school when her shiny new orange shirt, bought by her grandmother, was taken from her as a six-year old girl.

The annual Orange Shirt Day opens the door to global conversation on all aspects of Residential Schools. It is an opportunity to create meaningful discussion about the effects of Residential Schools and the legacy they have left behind. A discussion all Canadians can tune into and create bridges with each other for reconciliation. A day for survivors to be reaffirmed that they matter, and so do those that have been affected. Every Child Matters, even if they are an adult, from now on.

We ask that your child wear his/her Orange T-shirts, that was purchased by the school last year, to show support on Tuesday September 25. We will not be purchasing any new t-shirts this year, so ask that you either wear last year's t-shirt or wear a orange shirt that you may already own. There will be a permission form sent home asking if you would like your child to participate. Please contact Mrs. Hiemstra directly if you have any questions or concerns.



Important Message for Everyone who Stops in at the School

We would like to ask <u>ALL</u> visitors to the school to check in and out of the building at the office. MEDICATION: We can not administer medications such as Calamine lotion, Polysporin, Afterbite, anything with any kind of medicine in it. 

School Board News

The Pembina Hills Public Schools Board of Trustees is made up of seven locally elected trustees and is accountable to the Minister of Education. We directly supervise Mr. David Garbutt, our School Superintendent, but within Pembina Hills we employ approximately 350 teachers and 400 support staff, and are the largest employer in the area. The school board oversees a combined \$83.5 million budget for Pembina Hills and Alberta Distance Learning Centre. This is managed through a combination of central and site-based decision making.

As a school board we set the vision and direction for the division which includes creating policy, deciding how education services are delivered in our schools, and advocating for our local concerns at the provincial level. Your trustees are elected, local people who are passionate about education and doing what is best for students. Each elected trustee represents a ward and is the liaison with the schools situated in their area. The board's decisions are based on what is best for the school division as a whole.



Violence Threat Risk Assessment

How Pembina Hills responds to threats of violence

Young people dealing with difficult situations and challenges they can't resolve may resort to high risk behavior which puts them and others in danger. Because we want to keep *all* students and schools safe, we are working with our community partners to respond to and support those students who may pose a risk.

Our school administrators have completed intensive safety training through the Canadian Centre for Threat Assessment and Trauma Response. Working with Evergreen Catholic Schools, government agencies, the RCMP and community partners, we have developed a prevention and intervention protocol to guide our response to students who may pose a threat.

Fair Notice

I am sharing this message to give parents fair notice that our school will address and respond proactively to any high risk behavior and threats.

It is important for all parties to engage in the threat risk assessment process. However, if for some reason, there is a reluctance to participate in the process by the threat maker or parents and guardians, the assessment procedures will continue in order to ensure a safe and caring learning environment.

Our commitment to proactively respond to threats is a key element of this protocol. As always our goal is to keep our students and schools safe. We thank our protocol partners for working with us to sustain healthy, caring learning environments for the students we serve.




