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What is Orange T-shirt Day?

Every Child Matters

Orange Shirt Day is a legacy of the St. Joseph Mission (SJM) Residential School (1891-1981) Commemoration Project and Reunion events that took place in Williams Lake, BC, Canada, in May 2013. This project was the vision of Esketemc (Alkali Lake) Chief Fred Robbins, who is a former student himself.

The events were designed to commemorate the residential school experience, to witness and honour the healing journey of the survivors and their families, and to commit to the ongoing process of reconciliation. Chief Justice Murray Sinclair challenged all of the participants to keep the reconciliation process alive, and as a result of the realization that every former student had similar stories.

Orange Shirt Day is a legacy of this project. Former student Phyllis (Jack) Webstad told her story of her first day at residential school when her shiny new orange shirt, bought by her grandmother, was taken from her as a six-year old girl.

The annual Orange Shirt Day opens the door to global conversation on all aspects of Residential Schools. It is an opportunity to create meaningful discussion about the effects of Residential Schools and the legacy they have left behind. A discussion all Canadians can tune into and create bridges with each other for reconciliation. A day for survivors to be reaffirmed that they matter, and so do those that have been affected. Every Child Matters, even if they are an adult, from now on.

We are in the process of ordering Orange t-shirts for our Kindergarten class ONLY, for Thursday October 1. We asking students to either wear last year's t-shirt or wear an orange shirt that they may already own. There will be a permission form sent home asking if you would like your child to participate. Important Message for Everyone who Stops in at the School

MEDICATION: We can not administer medications such as Calamine lotion, Polysporin, Afterbite, anything with any kind of medicine in it. If a student requires to take any kind of medicine (prescription or over the counter) in to take during the day, the medication must be brought in by a parent to the school office. <u>Medication should be</u> in it's original packaging. Consent forms must be completed, medication will be kept and dispensed as directed under supervision in the office. For those students with Epipen, puffers, Twinject

etc. please inform office and teacher, bring those items to the office to make arrangement for safe storage.

Electoral Ward Bylaw Passed

Trustees voted in favor of Electoral Ward Bylaw 06-2020. The Bylaw changes the Ward structure of the division and reduces the number of trustees from seven (7) to six (6). These changes to the ward structure will come into effect for the October 2021 school trustee elections. Fort Assiniboine School will be part of Pembina Hills West Ward 2 which includes the - County of Barrhead Div 6 -Woodlands County Div 5*, 6, 7 - Town of Swan Hills - Big Lakes County * (* Indicates only the portion that is within Pembina Hills School Division)

School Messenger - Notice to Parents

This fall Pembina Hills School Division is implementing a phone, email and text messaging service called **School Messenger**. This service will allow schools and the division to contact a large number of people quickly. This will be especially important when we need to communicate information to you such as emergencies or important updates.

Please ensure that your child's school has your current contact information on file - delete old phone numbers and email addresses that are no longer in use. You will have an opportunity to provide this information on your child's demographic validation report. Schools send it home with students at the beginning of the school year.

To ensure your cell phone number is on file, or to update your contact information, you can also contact your school office at any time.

On September 25th, we plan to activate this service, and you will receive a text message to **Opt-in** for this service. As it is entirely optional, you can also choose to **Opt-out** at any time. However, we encourage parents to sign up for this service as it will help us keep the lines of communication open.

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Violence Threat Risk Assessment

How Pembina Hills responds to threats of violence

Young people dealing with difficult situations and challenges they can't resolve may resort to high risk behavior which puts them and others in danger. Because we want to keep *all* students and schools safe, we are working with our community partners to respond to and support those students who may pose a risk.

Our school administrators have completed intensive safety training through the Canadian Centre for Threat Assessment and Trauma Response. Working with Evergreen Catholic Schools, government agencies, the RCMP and community partners, we have developed a prevention and intervention protocol to guide our response to students who may pose a threat.

Fair Notice

I am sharing this message to give parents fair notice that our school will address and respond proactively to any high risk behavior and threats.

It is important for all parties to engage in the threat risk assessment process. However, if for some reason, there is a reluctance to participate in the process by the threat maker or parents and guardians, the assessment procedures will continue in order to ensure a safe and caring learning environment.

Our commitment to proactively respond to threats is a key element of this protocol. As always our goal is to keep our students and schools safe. We thank our protocol partners for working with us to sustain healthy, caring learning environments for the students we serve.



School Fees and Permission Forms in PowerSchool

Pembina Hills families can now pay for school fees and sign permission forms through the <u>PowerSchool Parent Portal</u>. Note - We are no longer using School Cash Online - do **not** sign in or use old bookmarks to access School Cash Online.

In your PowerSchool Parent Portal menu, just click on the item at the bottom called **"School Fees and Forms"**.
