<u>Literacy Rocks!</u> - Pembina Hills School Division has invested heavily in Literacy Support for K-12. Teachers have been attending grade group meetings to discuss literacy strategies (across all subjects, not just LA) and develop a common writing assessment rubric. Educational Assistants (EA) have currently attended 3 out of 4 scheduled district PD days, which include sessions on supporting literacy needs in the classroom. We are grateful for our school's Literacy Coach, retired principal and literacy guru, Darcie Eamor, who visits our K-5 classrooms several times each month to provide literacy support and instruction. Soon you will see writing rubrics being posted on our bulletin boards and hear students talk about how to "bump up" their writing to the next level.

What is Literacy Intervention?!

Thankfully at our last School Council meeting, several parents brought up concerns about the term intervention. Why am I receiving this letter? What does intervention mean? I read every night with my child, what's going on? Intervention is a common term used in education. Teachers are constantly assessing students and adjusting their lessons accordingly. If a student is struggling with a concept and/or has fallen behind, an "intervention" program is put into place. Interventions are specific targeted strategies to assist student learning, often in a small group or even one-on-one. Sometimes interventions are short term over a few days or weeks, sometimes for a few months. We want to emphasize the importance and urgency of literacy intervention, but we are not intending to cause panic/blame. We are all on this learning journey together. Please contact your classroom teacher for further information. I am also available to meet with parents too.

<u>Please keep reading with/to your child</u>, this is the number one factor in learning outside of school. Take time to ask a few comprehension questions about the story's plot, setting, characters, lessons learned, or relate it to your own life. A list of questions is included on the back of our newsletter.

Student Services presents assurance report

Assistant Superintendent of Student Services, Dr. Rob McGarva, presented the Board with a comprehensive report on the support services that the division provides to its students. Dr. McGarva indicated that from the pandemic, we are still seeing high levels of absences this year and that the new respiratory illnesses in children is also impacting academics. Alberta Education provided a learning loss grant but with delays in funding, it has been difficult to recruit staff or move people during the year. Work continues on expanding the impact of job postings.

Dr. McGarva notes that there has been an increase in complexity of needs with some students requiring multiple adults at one time to support them, putting physical and psychological stress on staff. The Mental Health grant allowed Pembina Hills to hire additional staff with training in social work or human services, focused on attendance and connecting families to community resources. School administrators will focus on the well-being of staff. Additional training is being provided for Educational Assistants as well as crisis response training all school staff. New practices are also being implemented with the division's Regulation Specialist.

2023-2026 Capital Plan

The Board approved the proposal and recommendation presented by Superintendent Michael Borgfjord for the Barrhead Composite High School Modernization and Right Sizing as its single project for the 2023-2026 capital plan. The Town of Barrhead is currently discussing the need for new community centre partnerships and possible child care spaces, and has expressed an interest in discussing a joint use project with the division.

2022-2023 Alternate school calendars amended

In the fall of 2022, Alberta Education released details of the Provincial Achievement Testing Program which included defined dates for the tests. This has created a conflict for four of Pembina Hills Schools (Eleanor Hall, Dunstable, Neerlandia Public Christian and Fort Assiniboine). As a result, the Board approved administration's recommendation that the school calendar for these schools be amended to accommodate the Grade 6 and 9 Mathematics test dates.


