


### Our Remembrance Day Assembly will be held on Tuesday November 2, 2023 at 10:45 a.m.

# **PHSD Board News**

Happy snowy November!

November 11 is a day we remember for all those who have served. They were ordinary Canadians who made extraordinary sacrifices.

What would it take to become a bus driver?

- Class 2 License If you don't already have this, we will train you! Training consists of 3 days in the classroom and then as much time as you need in the yard and bus. You will need to do a written test at registries and also a driving test once you are confident and ready to do so. Our trainers will work with you until you feel comfortable to do both tests.
- S Endorsement This is the school bus safety endorsement. If you are already class 1 or 2 licensed, we will train you for this endorsement. It is 2 days in class and 1 day in the yard/on road. All testing is done with us, not at registries. This training is included in the class 2 training that we provide, so you would only need to complete this portion if you are not doing your entire certification through us.
- Q Endorsement This is the air brakes endorsement. All of our buses are equipped with air brakes and therefore everyone will need this training if they don't already have a Q or class 1 on their license. It is a 1 day course in Edmonton and then a written test at registries.

Good news - Pembina Hills offers all the training for free and you even get a class 2 training bonus once you are employed by us!







Please make sure that your child is properly dressed for the weather, we certainly have had some cooler days and mornings. We have some strong Canadian kids that like to play outside and require winter gear especially ski pants, mitts and toque. It is critical that students have proper clothing for the weather as they are riding the bus. Despite the preventative maintenance on the bus fleet, there is always the possibility for a bus to break down, especially in colder weather. When dressing for the winter, please make sure your child is wearing the following: Winter coat (parka), winter (insulated) boots, Gloves/Mitten, Toque (if the parka does not have an insulated hood), Scarf. Although not all students travel on the bus, it is important that all students are properly dressed so that they are able to participate during the recess and lunch breaks.







Your bus driver will decide whether or not the school bus will run and will notify you. Our drivers are the most familiar with the weather and road conditions on their routes. Division-wide: If necessary, cancellations will be made by 6:00a.m. For safety reasons, schools will remain open even if buses are canceled. If you are concerned about sending your child to the bus stop or school because of bad weather or roads - even if our buses are running – you can always keep your child home. Beware of Scams Pembina Hills School Division had a report of an Unfortunate incident involving Caller ID phone spoofing and a Pembina Hills number,

What is caller ID spooling? When fraudsters manipulate the phone number on the call display to look like a legitimate number (particularly a local number) in an attempt to phish your personal information of steal money.

We will never ask you for your personal banking information or to pay for anything using gift cards. It's important to recognize potential Caller ID spooling. Always be vigilant and never assume phone numbers appearing on your call disptay are accurate. When in doubt, hang up and contact the division or school (or other business) directly.
