

Kindergarten Registration

Starting March 1, 2024, we are accepting new student registrations for the 2024-2025 school year. Pembina HIIIs has an online registration system called SchoolEngage. There are two ways to register depending on if you are brand new to Pembina Hills or if you have children already attending our schools.

Families who are new to Pembina Hills will need to create a SchoolEngage account. For screenshots and detailed instructions, see the New Student Registration page.

Existing families who want to register a new student (ie. Kindergarten) can access SchoolEngage through their PowerSchool Parent Portal

Before you register...Here's what you will need to provide:

- Proof of age such as a child's birth certificate or immigration documentation (for newcomers)
- Legal land description and rural address (Rural Students only)
- Copies of any court orders affecting student

We will also be hosting a Kindergarten Open House on Wednesday, April 24 from 1 -4 p.m. for you and your new Kindergarten student to tour the classroom and meet the teacher. If you have any questions please call the school office at 780-584-3751.



School Board News

Board approves capital plan priorities

As part of the province's annual budgeting process, school divisions are required to submit a list of capital projects for consideration. These projects can include new construction or modernization and are considered alongside all of the province's capital requests, which include hospitals, parks and highways.

When creating the priority list for Pembina Hills, staff review each school's age, size, enrollment, as well as any maintenance concerns. Projects are selected based on the identified needs of each school.

The board approved the following priorities:

1. Barrhead Composite High School – full modernization & right-sizing

This school was built in several sections from the 1950s to the 1980s and was built to accommodate 1,227 students. While some upgrades have occurred since the building was constructed, a series of extensive modernization upgrades is needed as well as a "right-sizing" to accommodate the current enrollment of 766 students. This project is estimated at \$34 million and is currently in the design and planning phase.

2. Barrhead Elementary School – partial modernization

This school was constructed in several phases between the 1970s and the 1990s. Modernization of this school consists of a series of upgrades including air handling units, rooftop heating units and electrical upgrades. This project is estimated at \$25 million.

3. Westlock Elementary School – partial modernization

This school was constructed in 1970, with expansions in 1986 and 2012. This building is in need of some modernization upgrades to the school building as well as sidewalks, parking lots and bus lane areas. This project is estimated at \$19 million.

These priority projects are included in the division's 2024 to 2027 Capital Plan available on the division website.

Earth Day Activities and Ideas

Celebrate Earth Day by appreciating and respecting the natural world. Here are some ideas to inspire you this year.

1. Support Our Pollinators!

Bring native bees and other pollinating creatures to your garden. One way to do this is by selecting the right plants.

2. Clean Up Plastic in Your Neighborhood or Local Park

One of the best ways to connect with the Earth is through cleanups! Go on a walk with a trash bag and help to clean up any plastic that you find.

3. Swap Out Your Kitchen and Household Products!

Think 100% recycled aluminum foil, chemical-free parchment paper for baking, compostable bags made with potato starch, and even vegetable-based inks on packaging.

4. Plant a Tree!

We love our trees! They capture carbon, cool overheated places, benefit agriculture, support pollinators, reduce the risk of disease transmission, and boost local economies.

5. Use Wildflowers and Native Plants

Wildflowers and indigenous species are not only beautiful but also attract native and beneficial insects that improve both pest control and pollination-meaning bigger flowers and bigger harvests. Try to simply add a couple of native plants to your garden each year, and you'll be amazed at the difference-they'll bring in pollinators as well as birds!

6. Reduce, Reuse, Recycle in the Garden

Caring about yourself and nature means being less wasteful and saving money, too. Who could argue with this? If you are a gardener, here are just a few ideas:

- Buy in bulk when you know that you'll need a lot of topsoil, mulch, compost, or other materials. This cuts down on plastic bags.
- Reuse, recycle, or return old plastic pots and trays.

7. Stop Pesticides and Chemicals in the Garden

- Use organic soil amendments to turn your poor garden soil into a nutrient-rich paradise in which plants will thrive.
- You don't need chemicals to get rid of pesky garden pests: Companion planting, natural remedies, and attracting predators to your garden can save you money and also save your plants.
- Some bugs are good for the garden!
- It's easy to use an organic plant fertilizer—made from just weeds and water.
- Gardening and farming methods such as not tilling the soil, growing cover crops during the off-season, and rotating crops help to retain organic materials in the soil.

8. Conserve Water!

Avoid overwatering your plants and improve their health by knowing how much your garden really needs. Avoid watering your garden vegetables and plants from overhead, which invites fungal disease. Water at the soil level.

9. Get Kids Involved!

Pass down a love of nature and plants to kids. There are lots of opportunities for hands-on learning experiences outside. -Children who grow vegetables, eat vegetables.
